DRESS CODE

Experience has shown that there is a relationship between behavior and the way a student is dressed. Good dress and grooming lead to good student behavior. Clean, neat clothing, which is suitable to the learning environment, is required. We encourage age appropriate dress.

In fairness to all students, the following dress code has been developed and is as follows:

- No midriff showing, even when their arms are raised above their heads.
- Shorts and skirts must come at least to the fingertips when arms are extended along the side of the body. Shorts and skirts must be longer than the shirt that is being worn.
- Shoes: please think safety, appropriate shoes for recess and PE activities. No high heels, no flip flops, no loose fitting or untied shoes, and no wheels.
- NO baggy or sagging pants. Pants should be no more than two inches larger than the student's waist size. When the pants are too baggy it becomes a safety concern for your child.
- No clothing or hats that promote/depict/show drug, sex, violence, or alcohol are allowed. (No WWF, skull, violent action figures, etc. shirts)
- Hats, scarves, sweatbands, handkerchiefs, etc. are not to be worn inside the building.

Clothing that is not consistent with the above guidelines shall result in a parent contact; corrective action and/or the student returning home to change.
